

Søndre og Nordre Nordli

Nordli was probably established in the older iron age (500 BC – 550 AD). The Sørli farm was possibly separated out at the start of the christian age. Kanskje ved overgangen til kristen tid ble Sørli skilt ut. In 1751 was Nordli divided into two farms, Nordli søndre og nordre (North and south Nordli). Sørli was also divided into two farms south and north. Both of these farms are now 100% used for private housing.

In the period from 1700 onwards there were tenants belong to the farms. All tenants were closed before 1900. Dragonrud, Slora, Berget, Hagelund and Listua are names of the tenants.

Søndre Nordli (South Nordli)

The farmhouse of Søndre Nordli was built in 1907, the cowshed in 1916 and the barn in 1926, while the storehouse in from approx. 1900. The farms had in the older times a house for drying grain.

The have been the following changes to the buildings after 1954: The barn has been torn down and a garage has been added.

The farm had in 1954 17 hektar cultivated land and some livestock. In 2018 this has been reduced to 14.9 hektar cultivated land and no animals. The reductions have been used for a school and roads. Søndre Nordli has been owned by the same family since 1625.

Nordre Nordli (North Nordli)

The farmhouse was built in 1921, the storehouse and workers quarter approx. 1870, while the outbuildings consist of older log buildings with newer panelling outside. The have been the following changes to the buildings after 1954: The outbuildings were torn down in 1958-1959, a new cowshed/barn was bult in 1969. In addition, a new tool shed and house for the retired farmes were ready in 1982.

In 1954: 17 hektar cultivated land and some livestock. In 2018 the cultivated land is somewhat reduced to footpath/cyclepath and Elveparken. No livestock after 1990. Nordre Nordli has been owned by the same family since 1896.
