

Feiring Bruk

When Knut Ollendorff began his research for raw material resources for crushed stone and gravel in Nedre Romerike at the end of the 1950s, interest in Feiring in Lørenskog fell due to the particularly suitable quality of the rock deposits. The finds he had made in Feiringåsen in 1959 were very interesting, and in 1960 the construction of a stone crushing plant began.

The crushing plant started in 1962, and since its inception, Feiring Bruk has developed into Eastern Norway's largest supplier of rock masses in various shapes and qualities, and also conducts asphalt production through its own company. Feiring Bruk has a license for 100 years, until 2062.

At Feiring, it is mainly mined on gneiss / granite. Material from here is mainly used for road construction, concrete, asphalt and certified ballast crushing for the railway.

The actual crushing plant at Feiring is not very visible from where you stand now, but the area extends over an area of approx. 790 daa and includes, in addition to crushing plants and asphalt production, also a workshop and laboratory.
